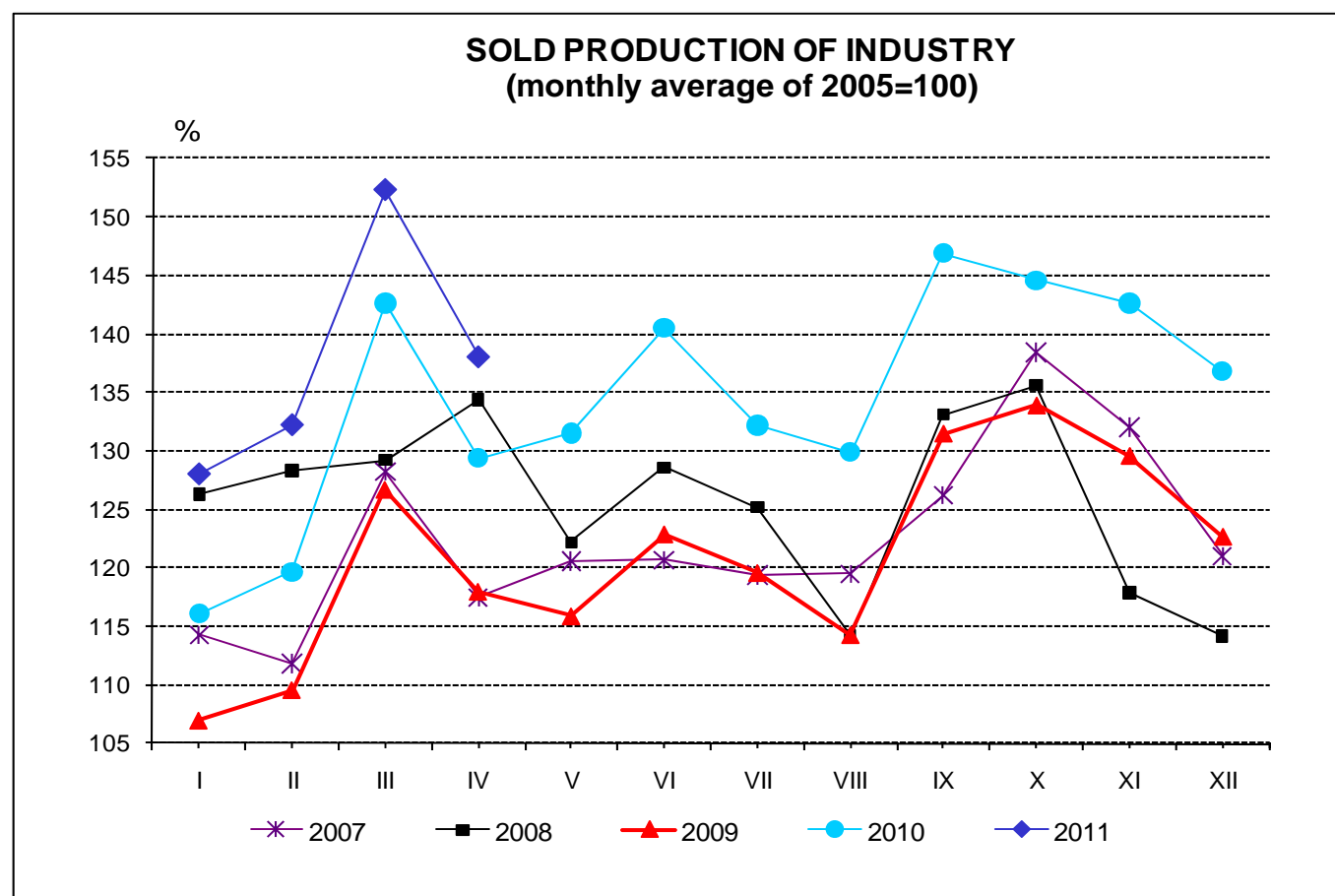

According to the preliminary data, **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons) in April 2011 was by 6.6% higher than in the previous year, but lower by 9.4% than in March 2011. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 8.7% than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 1.4% than in March 2011.

As compared to April 2010, an increase in sold production was reported in 25 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in manufacture of furniture – by 26.5%, manufacture of metal products – by 16.9%, manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers – by 16.2%, manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products – by 15.0%, manufacture of rubber and plastic products – by 11.5% and manufacture of food products – by 10.2%. A drop in sold production of industry, as compared to April 2010, was recorded in 9 divisions, among others, in, manufacture of electrical equipment – by 11.9%, manufacture of machinery and equipment – by 6.0%, manufacture of pharmaceutical products – by 5.5%, manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products – by 5.0% and in mining of coal and lignite – by 3.2%.

In the period January-April 2011 sold production of industry was by 8.1% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005 are presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair works, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons in April of 2011 was by 15.6% higher than in the previous year and by 9.7% higher than in March of 2011. After eliminating the seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level by 14.9% higher than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 0.5% higher in comparison to March of 2011.

In comparison with April of the previous year, an increase of production was recorded in enterprises whose basic type of activity is construction work associated with civil engineering – by 36.5%, and specialised construction activities – by 21.0%. A decrease was recorded in entities carrying out work connected with construction of buildings – by 1.1%.

In comparison to March of 2011, an increase in production occurred in enterprises whose basic type of activity is work connected with civil engineering – by 37.4%, and in entities performing specialised construction activities – by 1.2%, while production decreased in entities dealing mainly with construction of buildings by 2.6%.

The level of construction and assembly production realized in the period January-April of 2011 was by 17.0% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.
