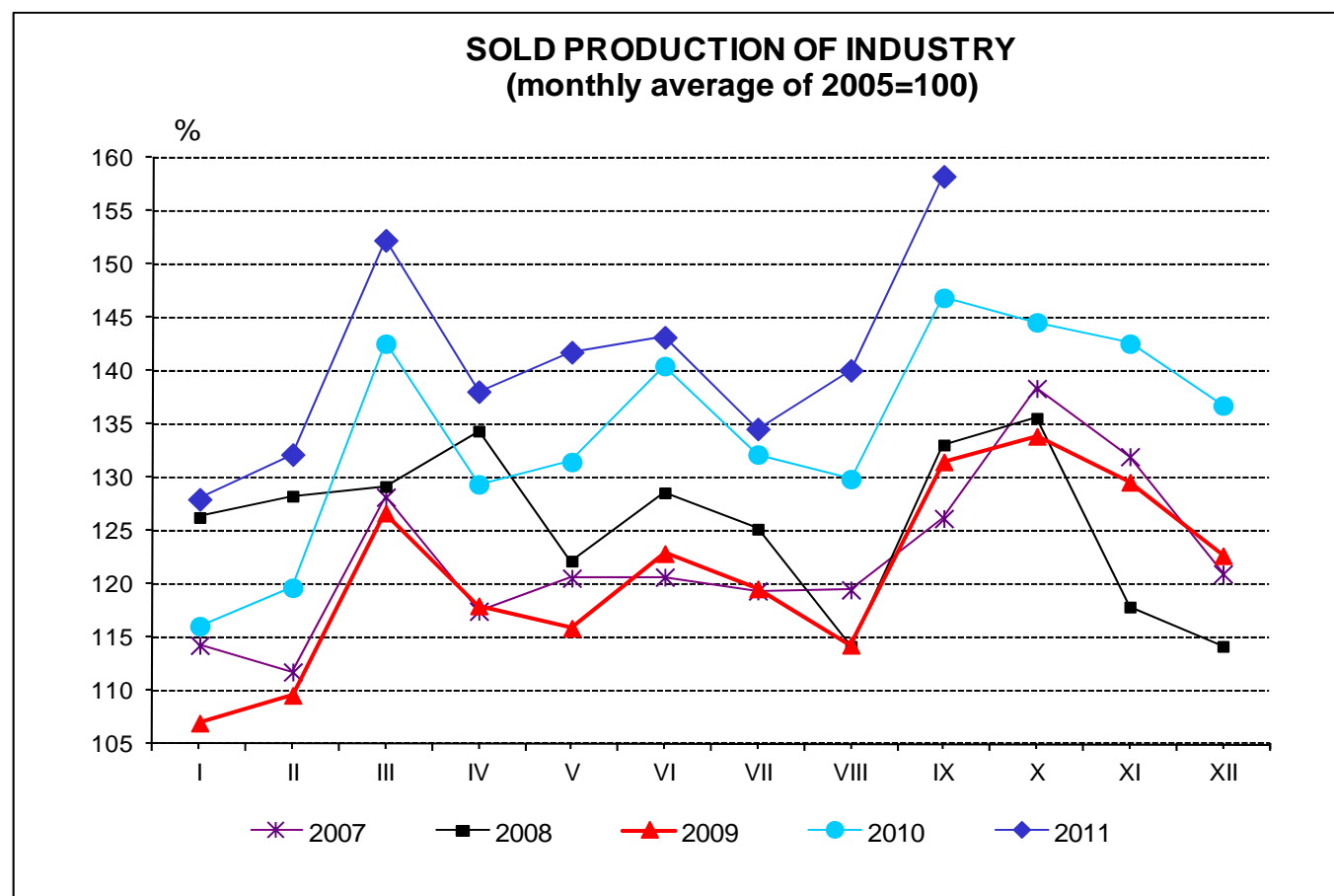

According to the preliminary data **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons) in September 2011 was by 7.7% higher than in the previous year and by 13.0% higher than in August 2011. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 7.1% than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 1.9% than in August 2011.

As compared to September 2010, an increase in sold production was reported in 26 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in manufacture of furniture – by 20.5%, manufacture of basic metals – by 18.9%, manufacture of metal products – by 16.7%, manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers – by 11.8%, manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products – by 10.3% and manufacture of food products – by 9.7%. A drop in sold production of industry, as compared to September 2010, was recorded in 8 divisions, among others, in, manufacture of pharmaceutical products – by 18.2%, manufacture of machinery and equipment – by 10.9%, in mining of coal and lignite – by 6.0% and in manufacture of chemicals and chemical products – by 5.2%.

In the period January-September 2011 sold production of industry was by 7.0% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005 are presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair work, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons in September 2011 was by 18.1% higher than a year before and by 18.3% higher than in August 2011. After eliminating the seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level by 17.8% higher than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 4.1% higher in comparison to August 2011.

Both, in comparison to September 2010 and to August 2011, an increase in production was recorded in all divisions of construction. In relation to September 2010, in entities dealing mainly with specialised construction activities the production grew by 32.0 %, in entities whose basic type of activity is civil engineering by 20.7%, and in entities specialising in the construction of buildings by 9.5 %.

In comparison to August of this year, an increase in production was recorded in enterprises whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 23.5%, in entities performing mainly the construction of buildings – by 17.5%, and in those performing specialised construction activities – by 10.9 %.

In the period January-September 2011, construction and assembly production was 18.2% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of the construction and assembly production, in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005 are presented in the graph below:
