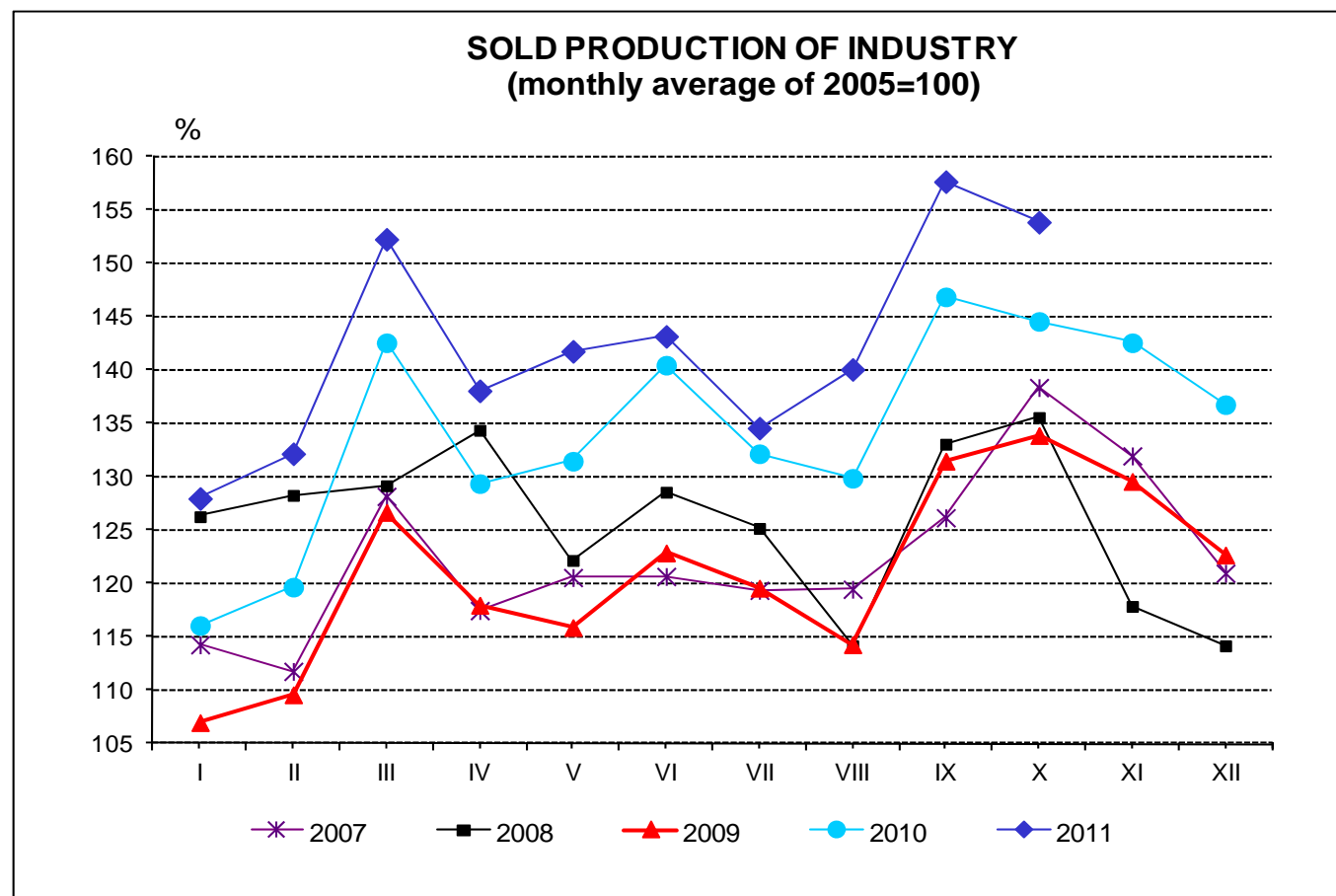

According to the preliminary data **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons) in October 2011 was by 6.5% higher than in the previous year, but lower by 2.4% than in September 2011. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 7.0% than in the corresponding month of the previous year and lower by 0.2% than in September 2011.

As compared to October 2010, an increase in sold production was reported in 25 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in manufacture of basic metals – by 19.2%, manufacture of furniture – by 17.8%, manufacture of metal products – by 14.6%, manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers – by 12.3%, manufacture of paper and paper products – by 9.6% and manufacture of rubber and plastics products – by 9.0%. A drop in sold production of industry, as compared to October 2010, was recorded in 9 divisions, among others, in, manufacture of pharmaceutical products – by 20.4%, in mining of coal and lignite – by 10.2%, in manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products – by 6.3% and manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products – by 3.4%.

In the period January-October 2011 sold production of industry was by 7.6% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005 are presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair work, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons, was in October 2011 by 8.9% higher than a year before and by 4.3% lower than in September 2011. After eliminating the seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level by 14.9% higher than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 1.5% lower in comparison to September 2011.

In comparison to October 2010, an increase in production was recorded in entities whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 24.9%, and in entities dealing mainly with specialised construction activities – by 18.0%. In turn, a decrease was recorded in entities specialising in the construction of buildings – by 10.2%.

In comparison to September 2011, an increase in production was recorded in entities dealing mainly with civil engineering – by 6.3%, and a drop occurred in enterprises whose basic type of activity is the construction of buildings – by 16.7%, and in those performing specialised construction activities – by 0.7%.

In the period January-October 2011, construction and assembly production was by 17.2% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of the construction and assembly production, in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005, are presented in the graph below:
