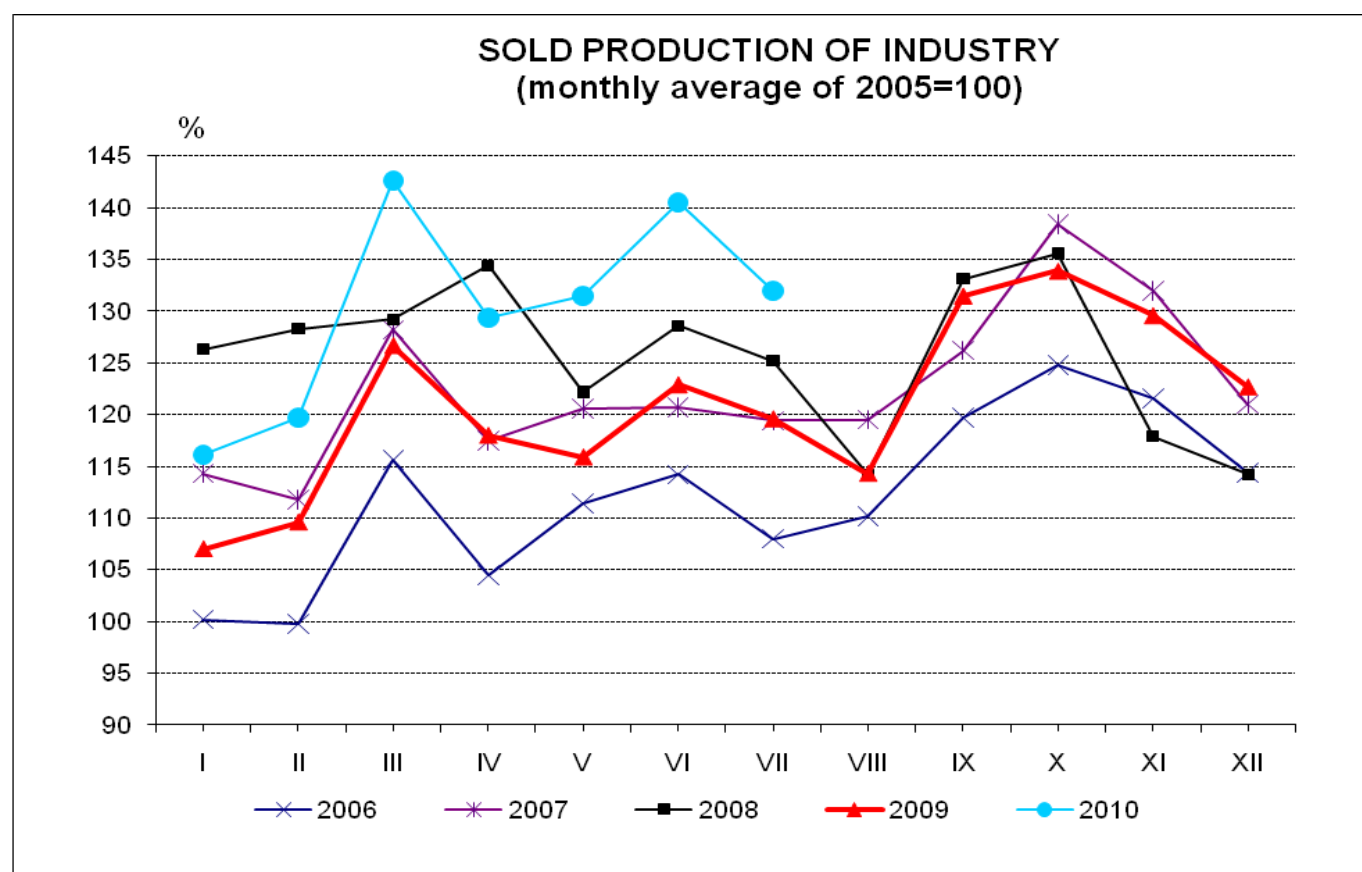

According to the preliminary data, **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons) in July 2010 was by 10,3% higher than in the corresponding month of the previous year, but lower by 6,1% than in June 2010. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 11,3% than in the corresponding month of the previous year, but lower by 0,3% than in June 2010.

As compared to July 2009, an increase in sold production was reported in 25 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in, manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products – by 54,6%, manufacture of chemicals and chemical products – by 34,9%, manufacture of other non-metallic mineral products – by 19,2%, manufacture of paper and paper products – by 18,7%, manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers – by 15,3% and manufacture of metal products – by 15,2%. A drop in sold production of industry, as compared to July 2009, was recorded in 9 divisions, among others, in, manufacture of furniture – by 7,7%, manufacture of basic metals – by 6,3%, manufacture of other transport equipment – by 5,9% and manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products – by 2,3%.

In the period January-July 2010 sold production of industry was by 10,4% higher than in the corresponding period of the previous year.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2005 is presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair works, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons in July 2010 was by 0,8% higher than in the previous year, but lower by 3,0% than in June 2010. Having eliminated the influence of seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level by 1,5% lower than in the corresponding month of the previous year and by 2,2% in comparison to June 2010.

In relation to July of the previous year, an increase of production was recorded in entities the basic activity of which is specialised construction activities by 3,6% and in entities engaged mainly in civil engineering by 1,1%. In entities mainly involved in construction of buildings production decreased by 0,8%.

In comparison to June 2010, the production grew in enterprises the basic activity of which are works connected with civil engineering by 1,9%. However, a drop was reported in entities mainly involved in specialized construction activities by 5,6% and in realizing the construction works connected with construction of buildings by 5,5%.

In the period January-July of 2010 the level of the construction and assembly production was by 5,7% lower than in the corresponding period of the previous year.
