## 

In March of 2015, **sold production of industry** was by 8.8% higher than in March of 2014, whereas an increase of 2.9% was reported in **construction-assembly production**. In the period January-March of 2015, sold production of industry was by 5.3% higher than in the corresponding period of 2014 which saw a 4.9% increase, whereas construction-assembly production was by 3.5% higher than in the corresponding period of 2014 which saw a 10.6% increase.

Index numbers of industrial and construction-assembly production in real time (constant prices) were:



According to the preliminary data, **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons), in March of 2015, was by 8.8% higher than in the previous year (when an increase of 5.5% was recorded) and by 13.4% higher than in February of 2015. After eliminating the seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 6.0% than in the corresponding month of 2014 and by 0.8% higher than in February of 2015.

As compared to March of 2014, an increase in sold production was reported in 30 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in manufacture of computer, electronic and optical products – by 18.4%, manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers – by 16.9%, manufacture of furniture – by 14.0%, manufacture of electrical equipment – by 13.1%, manufacture of food products – by 10.2, manufacture of machinery and equipment – by 9.6%, manufacture of metal products and manufacture of paper and paper products – by 9.4% each. A drop in sold production of industry, as compared to March of 2014, was recorded in 4 divisions, among others, in manufacture of pharmaceutical products – by 16.5% and electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply – by 1.5%.

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2010 are presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, **construction and assembly production** (in constant prices), including investment and repair work, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons, was in March of 2015 by 2.9% higher than a year before (when a decrease was recorded by 17.4%) and by 28.2% in comparison to February of 2015. After eliminating the seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level by 0.5% lower than in March of 2014 and by 0.6% higher in comparison to February of 2015.

In relation to March of 2014, an increase in production was recorded in entities dealing mainly with specialised construction activities – by 8.7% and in entities specializing in civil engineering – by 6.0%, while a decrease in production occurred in entities whose basic type of activity is the construction of buildings – by 3.5%.

In comparison to February of 2015, an increase in production was recorded in all divisions of construction: in entities whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 33.7%, in entities performing specialised construction activities – by 33.6%, and in enterprises specialized in the construction of buildings – by 20.2%
