

In September of 2015, **sold production of industry** was by 4.1% higher than in September of 2014, whereas a decrease of 2.5% was reported in **construction-assembly production**. In the period January-September of 2015, sold production of industry was by 4.5% higher than in the corresponding period of 2014 which saw a 3.4% increase, whereas construction-assembly production was by 2.0% higher than in the corresponding period of 2014 which saw a 5.5% increase.



According to the preliminary data, **sold production of industry** in constant prices (in enterprises employing more than 9 persons), in September of 2015, was by 4.1% higher than in the previous year (when an increase of 4.2% was recorded) and by 15.1% higher than in August of 2015. After eliminating the seasonal factors, sold production of industry reached the level higher by 4.2% than in the corresponding month of 2014 and by 1.5% higher as compared to August of 2015.

As compared to September of 2014, an increase in sold production was reported in 24 (out of 34) industry divisions, among others, in manufacture of metal products – by 6.6%, manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers and semi-trailers, manufacture of rubber and plastic products and printing and reproduction of recorded media – by 6.3% each, manufacture of machinery and equipment – by 6.2%, manufacture of electrical equipment – by 5.7%, manufacture of food products – by 5.4%. A drop in sold production of industry, as compared to September of 2014, was recorded in 10 divisions, among others, in manufacture of wearing apparel – by 6.6%, manufacture of coke and refined petroleum products – by 3.5%, manufacture of basic metals – by 2.8%, manufacture of pharmaceutical products – by 2.0%,

Indices of sold production of industry in comparison with an average monthly level in 2010 are presented in the graph below:



According to preliminary data, construction and assembly production (in constant prices), including investment and repair work, carried out domestically by construction enterprises employing more than 9 persons, was in September of 2015 by 2.5% lower than a year before (when an increase was recorded by 5.6%) and by 11.6% higher in comparison to August of 2015. After eliminating the seasonal factors, construction and assembly production reached the level by 0.9% lower than in September of 2014 and by 1.2% in comparison to August of 2015.

In relation to September of 2014, a decrease in production was recorded in entities whose basic type of activity is the construction of buildings – by 8.0% and in entities specialising in civil engineering – by 0.3%, an increase was noted in entities dealing mainly with specialised construction activities – by 0.8%.

In comparison to August of 2015, an increase in production was recorded in enterprises whose basic type of activity is civil engineering – by 21.0% and in entities dealing mainly with specialised construction activities – by 18.1%, a decrease was noted in entities specialised in the construction of buildings – by 4.0%.
